

Airbnb.org, JCS 211 Miami and Volunteer Florida announce disaster response partnerships during peak hurricane season

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Key Takeaways Airbnb.org is signing new disaster response agreements with Jewish Community Services of South Florida (JCS), which operates 211 Miami, and Volunteer Florida during peak hurricane season. The organizations are committing to quickly mobilize emergency housing during disasters impacting Miami-Dade County.

Airbnb.org, a nonprofit founded by Airbnb to provide emergency housing in times of crisis, is announcing new disaster response agreements with locally based Miami partners to accelerate access to temporary housing for people displaced by disasters across Miami-Dade County.

The agreements with Jewish Community Services of South Florida's (JCS) 211 Miami Program and Volunteer Florida are designed to mobilize housing support within 24 hours of a disaster, helping displaced residents find a home to stay in that meets their needs—at no cost to them.

Since 2020, Airbnb.org has provided 40,000 nights of emergency housing to Floridians during crises, including hurricanes Helene, Milton and Debby in 2024. By partnering with nonprofits and government organizations before disaster strikes, Airbnb.org can provide housing support more quickly and in more places.

How it works

Under the agreements, JCS 211 Miami and Volunteer Florida will lead local identification of people with emergency housing needs and coordination with local responders, while Airbnb.org will support these efforts by providing free, emergency housing to displaced residents.

Airbnb.org leverages the Airbnb platform to connect people who need a place to stay with Airbnb homes, enabling guests to book homes that meet their needs, including kitchens, laundry rooms, and pet-friendly spaces. All stays are offered at no cost to guests and funded by Airbnb.org.

How to help

Anyone interested in supporting those impacted by hurricanes can visit Airbnb.org to either:

- Donate to Airbnb.org—100 percent of donations go directly toward connecting people in crisis with emergency housing.
- If you're an Airbnb host, you can sign up to provide discounted Airbnb.org stays.
